Our Story

- Every year, hundreds of workers are disabled by on-the-job injuries in Maryland.
- Tragically, on average, 60 workers in Maryland lose their lives on-the-job each year.
- Their children many times are forgotten when these losses occur. Kids' Chance of Maryland, Inc. provides an opportunity for these children to pursue their education, reach their goals, and fulfill their dreams for the future.

What is Kids' Chance of Maryland, Inc.?

The purpose of Kids' Chance is to provide financial scholarships for children of catastrophically or fatally injured workers to help them complete their undergraduate education or vocational schooling. It is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation developed by a diverse group of concerned volunteers associated with Maryland's business and workers' compensation community including representatives of employers, insurers, medical and vocational rehabilitation providers, and claimant and defense attorneys.

Which children are eligible for the scholarships?

Students must have had a parent or guardian who has suffered a catastrophic or fatal accidental injury or occupational disease while working for a Maryland employer. Students may not be older than 25 years of age.

How long is this scholarship for?

Scholarships are offered for one semester. Applicants must reapply at the end of each semester in order to be considered for scholarship renewal.

What does the scholarship cover?

Scholarship awards vary and depend largely on the needs and educational expenses of the student. Scholarships cover tuition and books, but may also include housing and meals.



Students Currently Receiving Kids' Chance of Maryland Scholarships

For the 2023 academic year, there are 12 students receiving Kids' Chance scholarships. Since its founding in 1996, Kids' Chance of Maryland has helped more than 160 students.

History

Kids' Chance of Maryland, Inc. was founded in 1996. We are one of 50 independent state chapter members of Kids' Chance of America. The first Kids' Chance, Inc. was founded in Georgia in 1988.
